THE REVIEW AND APPROVAL PROCESS INCLUDES ENGAGING AN OUTSIDE CONSULTANT WHO USES SALARY SURVEYS AND STUDIES OF NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS TO PROPOSE A COMPENSATION PACKAGE. THE REVIEW AND APPROVAL OCCUR UPON HIRING OF THE OFFICER, RENEWAL OR EXTENSION OF THE EMPLOYEE'S EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT, OR WHEN THE COMPENSATION IS MODIFIED. AFTER THE EXECUTIVE COMPENSATION COMMITTEE HAS SETTLED ON A COMPENSATION MATTER, THE RESULTS ARE REPORTED TO THE BOARD. THE COMPENSATION OF THE CURRENT CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER WAS APPROVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMPENSATION COMMITTEE IN 2009, 2012, 2015, AND AGAIN IN 2017 AS PART OF THE RENEWAL OF HIS EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT.
